The Australian Golf Heritage Society (AGHS) is a group of golfers and historians seeking to preserve Australia's golfing history.

The aims of the AGHS are to:

- Encourage the collection, recording and preservation of information connected to the history of golf in Australia;
- Verify the authenticity of physical items associated with Australian golf history, and provide a means of storing, restoring and displaying these physical items;
- Inform golfers, golf clubs and the wider community of this information and display these physical items in a manner which tells their story, and;
- Promote hickory events as a celebration of the origins of the game.

The AGHS has four main activities:

MUSEUM

The Museum has a diverse, interesting and nationally significant collection of golfing artefacts going back to the second half of the nineteenth century—the early days of golf in Australia. It also houses the most extensive golf reference library

in Australia. The Museum can provide advice on the safe storage, restoration and preservation of golfing artefacts.

It is open on Sundays from 10:00am to 4:00pm (other times by appointment), and admission is free.

HISTORIANS GROUP

The Historians conduct seminars of interest to golf historians. They can provide advice and assistance to members setting out to collect, research and write about the history of their club.

PUBLICATIONS

The Society distributes their own newsletter, '*The Brassie*' three times a year. As well as keeping you up to date on Society events, '*The Brassie*' often includes members articles on golfing history.

PLAYING EVENTS

The Society organises and supports golf days at various courses throughout the year. Here players can set themselves the challenge of playing with hickory shafted and vintage clubs. Most events are played off handicap.

The Society can also provide expert advice on assembling and maintaining a hickory play set.
